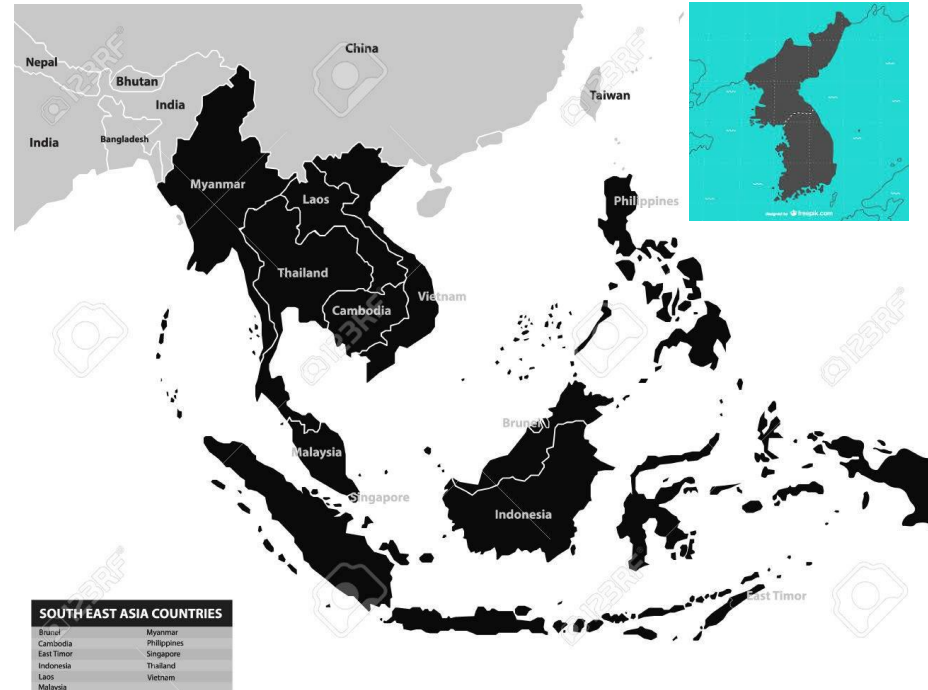
- The Founders Council is made up of founding partners to both the Compact of Mayors and the Covenant of Mayors

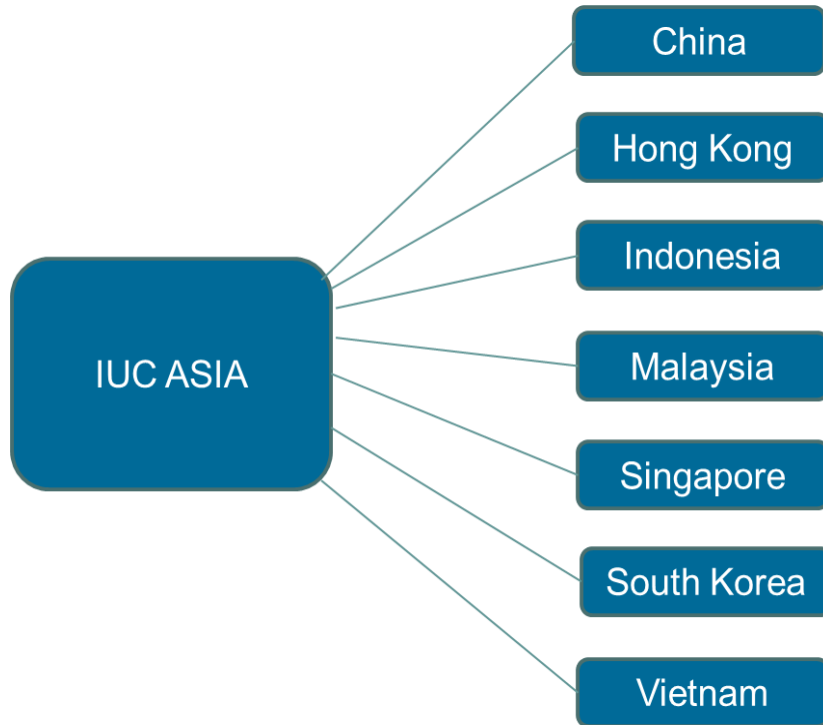

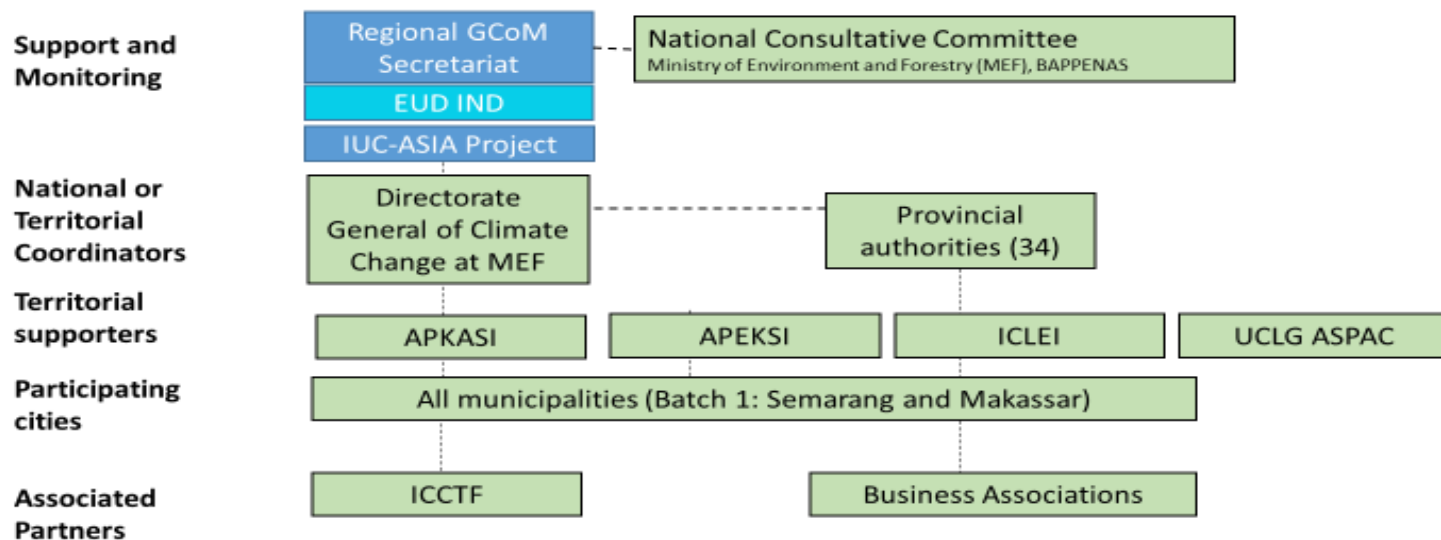

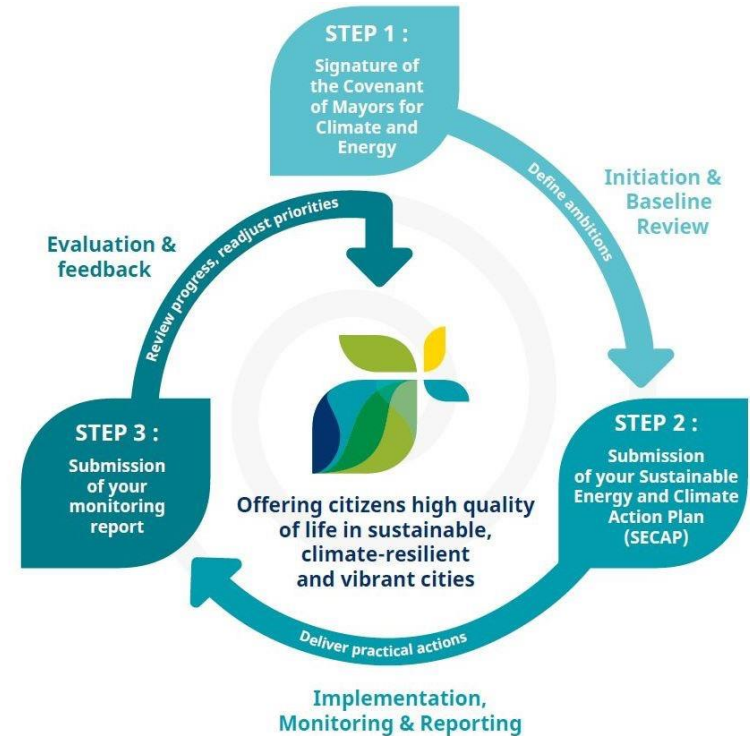
OUR MISSION

WHAT WILL BE REQUIRED TO CITIES JOINING THE GCOM?

1. Signing Agreement on Green house gas reduction and climate adaptation with GCoM
2. Submit a Climate Action Plan including emissions inventory - target setting (Mitigation - Adaptation), actions
3. Implement the city's Climate Action Plan
4. Conduct periodical monitoring of the CAP implementation and submit monitoring report
