- Established on 25 May 2000 in Surabaya
- Number of members is 98 cities (all cities in Indonesia)
- The chairman : Mayor of South Tangerang, Airin Rachmi Diany

The main roles :

- As a representative of Indonesian cities
- As a bridge between Indonesian cities with other stakeholders both at national and international level
- Provide services to the members through the programs among others inter local government cooperation, capacity building, advocacy
- As a clearing house among the cities and other stakeholders
- As a lesson learnt and exchange forum among the cities





- General Assembly of APEKSI in 2012 mandated Sustainable Development as one of the program as a soul of development of Indonesian cities
- APEKSI established sustainable development/environment program since 2009
- One of the program is climate change
- Cooperated with ICLEI, GIZ, Mercy Corps Indonesia, AFD, Ministry of Environment.
- Based on our main function, programs that have been developed assessment, capacity building, advocacy, building networking and information dissemination.

ASSESSMENT



- Self assessment on environment program especially climate change initiative of the cities
- Assessment of climate change initiative in 5 cities, in cooperation with ICLEI Oceania
- Assessment on energy efficiency in 10 cities, in cooperation with AFD (France Development Institution)
- Supporting assessment on climate change financial conducted by GIZ, CDIA, Bappenas and Ministry of Environment



NETWORKING







Working Group (POKJA) of Climate Change establishment in 2012. Right now member of working group is 17 cities who represented by Bappeda or Environement Agency (BLH) mostly. The roles to develop and dialogue with the Government on climate change implementation in the local. There is regular meeting every year for discussion, capacity building and exchange among members.

Together with ICLEI, GIZ and UCLG ASPAC, established Indonesian Climate Alliance (ICA), a networking of government/non government who working on climate change. The roles to share, exchange and collaboration development on climate change activities. The current Board is APEKSI, Mercy Corps Indonesia, ICLEI, CCROM, Kehati Foundation, Burung Indonesia, The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and IESR. Our last succeeded activity was Climate Week.

ADVOCACY







Mayor Forum was established in 2009 in Palembang but the then continued by **National Dialogue which conducted by** working group. National Dialogue on Climate **Change was established since 2012. The** dialogue between APEKSI (represented by working group) and Government and conducted every year. Previously only included Ministry of Environment, and now included other ministries : Bappenas, MoHA, **Public Work, and MoF.**

In collaboration with ICLEI Indonesia conducted two times Compact of Mayors in 2015 and 2016 in Bogor and Jakarta

CAPACITY BUILDING







Conducted training, workshop and seminar, in collaboration with other institutions such as GIZ (Clean Air), Mercy Corps Indonesia and ICLEI on issues : clean air, vulnerability assessment, emission accounting and disaster risk reduction and climate change, efficiency energy strategy.

In collaboration with ICMA (International City /County Management Association, based in Washington DC) we conducted Professional Fellowship Program which one of the issue on climate change since 2011 until now. It is also good potential to develop cooperation between two cities (Indonesia and USA).

CAPACITY BUILDING







In cooperation with ICLEI (International Local) **Government for Sustainability**), we run 2 projects for 3 years, Urban LEDS (Low **Emission Development Strategies) and ACCCRN** (Asian Cities on Climate Change **Resilient Networks).** For Urban LEDS we facilitated 2 model cities, Bogor and **Balikpapan and 4 satellite cities, Bogor District** and South Tangerang City and Tarakan City and Bontang City. For ACCCRN we facilitated Sukabumi, Bandung, Cimahi, Bogor, Jambi. **Urban LEDS aimed to facilitate city will have** development strategy on low emission and **ACCRN** on resilient city..



BEST PRACTICE



Best practices publication: as a media on good practices dissemination.
12 editions were published some of them on mitigation and adaptation actions



- Best practice transfer program (BPTP)
 - Transfer and replication good practices based on the needs, resources and local wisdom.
 - BPTP can be:
- Transfer of idea
- Transfer of application, skill, technology
- Transfer of process/system/management

- Knowledge Management Forum, climate change working group forum to share the experience and to conduct dialog with the government









Inter Local Government Cooperation





Under partnership among local government in ASEAN, DELGOSEA (Democratic Local Government in South East Asia), we facilitate exchange, transfer and replication good practices among the cities including on mitigation issue : low carbon city, waste bank. Delgosea term 1 in 2010 – 2012 and Delgosea term 2 in 2013 – 2016, now we focusing on policy dialogue in the regional and national level and Asean engagement.

Partnership among parties of 2 Indonesian cities, Swedish cities, SKL (Swedish Local Government Association), APEKSI, Ministry of Public Work, facilitated peer to peer learning between 2 Indonesian-Swedish on Symbiocity Program. The program focused on sustainable city development, rather on mitigation process.

RESILIENCE CITY PROGRAM









- Started by Workshop on Best Practice Transfer Program (BPTP) in 2012, which was one of the good practice resilience city, Semarang City who implemented this since 2009.
- APEKSI and Mercy Corps Indonesia (through ACCCRN, Asian Climate Change Cities Resilient Network) : selected 6 pilot cities (Palembang, Cirebon, Pekalongan, Blitar, Probolinggo, and Tarakan) to replicate Semarang and Bandar Lampung (2 pilot cities of Mercy Corps Indonesia since 2009) experiences.
- Each pilot city choosed the practice based on their need to be replicated : wave breaker, rain harvesting, local economic development.
- The program steps : capacity building on vulnerability assessment and resilience strategy development, team city building and strengthening, project management development.
- We extended with light touch cities for 9 cities: Banda Aceh, Pangkalpinang, Tangerang, South Tangerang, Bekasi, Pontianak, Banjarmasin, Manado, and Mataram.

ANOTHER PARTNERSHIP







- APEKSI in collaboration with Mercy Corps Indonesia, Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection, and PATTIRO developed a manual on climate change with gender mainstreaming. We had trialed a training at 9 cities.
- In partnership with APIK-USAID, we have been supported to develop a strategic plan on CCA – DRR integration
- Involved by Mercy Corps Indonesia on private collaboration on resilient city development module. Then will promote the module to the members.
