It will be the first in a **series of thematic** online discussion rounds to be implemented in the coming months.




The Partnership on **Security in Public Spaces** held its kick-off meeting in January 2019.



What's in?

- Frontload the use of the as yet unallocated **EUR 37 billion** of cohesion policy funding within the 2014-2020 cohesion policy programmes, thus providing a much needed **boost to economic investments**.
- Expenditure **newly eligible** under the EU structural and solidarity funds - for instance to support health systems, procure medical equipment or ensure access to healthcare for vulnerable groups, and the current possibilities to mobilise financing through ERDF and ESF.
- Integrated support to Member States through dedicated **CRII country teams** in charge of fast decision-making at the most practical level, as well as discuss State aid, financial regulation, etc.


