
Component 2:





New EU Cities 2018 - Barnsley (UK)



- ✓ Medium sized city closely located to three major cities (Leeds, Nottingham, Liverpool)
- ✓ Population of around 250.000 inh.
- ✓ Former coal-based economy (`til 90s)
- ✓ After collapse (90s): regeneration effort new jobs, especially developing digital industries
- ✓ Co-operation with China not to operate in a vacuum but integrated into other projects (URBACT Techtown)
- ✓ Project: Developing a digital campus on a 4 ha town centre site - Digital Media Centre

New EU Cities 2018 - Nice (FR)




- ✓ Metropolitan area with 500.000 inhabitants
- √ Eco-Vallée project
- ✓ Centre of Excellence in charge of Smart City strategy, the Agency for Energy Performance (Smart Grids) and the Department for Innovation
- ✓ French Tech Côte d' Azur network, start-ups and also the University
 Côte d' Azur, overall support from the Provence Alpes Côte d' Azur region




4. Coordination and Communication – Local DRCs at centre

DRC plays the key role in local coordination



Key contact person is needed for effective communication




- Focal point for all communication
