
The EU's IUC Programme at a Glance – Focus on City-to-City

Global EU Programme launched 2017 managed by the **Foreign Policy Instrument (FPI)**. Aims to support:


- Bilateral EU policy objectives;
- Implementation of <u>UN Urban Agenda</u>, the UN <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u>, and the Paris Climate Change Agreement

In Asia, the IUC is working in two main areas:

- Component 1: Multi-City Cooperation on Sustainable Urban Development
- 2. Component 2: Support Cities in Asia on Climate Change Mitigation, Adaptation and Clean Energy Access (especially within the Global Covenant of Mayors GCoM)
- Timeline: 2017 2020 (1st Phase)
- Team based in Beijing and Indonesia
































The IUC Global Programme: EU Cities working on Circular Economy








Cluster Approach in Five Thematic Networks

- 1. Five clusters are focal points for EU and non-EU cities for real cooperation projects
- 2. Thematic experts help cities to conduct mapping regarding the specific cluster, including main stakeholders, major events or platforms, examples of pilot projects and funding opportunities.
- 3. Design the cooperation projects by detailed action plan with help of experts
- 4. Different cities working on same cluster and achieve the best synergies
- 5. Competitive Fund for Pilot Actions



Cooperation Approach


Triple-Helix methodology




Urban Cooperation Action Plan








Pilot Example 2: EU Cities and Liuzhou (Guangxi) – S&T Park













