Description: Urbanisation is a complex issue, involving many different players and sectors in myriads of situations. Public policy for the development of urban areas is most successfully implemented when it is joined-up, integrated and inclusive. In Europe, cities are increasingly seeking to address complex twenty-first century issues and challenges, and, through working together and networking, are developing innovative and original solutions that would not have been possible if left exclusively to the national level. Therefore, in 2016, the EU agreed the Urban Agenda and, in the same year, was a major player in the New Urban Agenda under Habitat 3. Accordingly, countries across the world share a common interest in promoting a human-centred and environmentally-friendly urban development model which delivers clean, resource-efficient, socially fair, smart cities. The EU has increasingly supported actions in this field on a global scale including the URBELAC (2010-2013) project with Latin America, two generations of the World Cities project (2015-2018), and the International Urban Cooperation (IUC) programme (2017-2020). All these programmes have defined some thematic networks for the cooperation. This workshop will examine the results of this cooperation regarding added value for the public authorities and the private sector. In two sessions, speakers from Asia and Europe will participate in moderated thematic discussions and make recommendations for the future. A special emphasis will be placed on the effects of the Covid19-crisis to the respective cities' actions in the thematic areas of green deal and digital transition (see below) as well as to the international cooperation capacity. The session complemented with a presentation by the IUC Methodology Taskforce (MTF) on lessons learned and recommendations for future city-to-city cooperation.

Speakers' information:

Rudolf Niessler is Principal Adviser for International Relations at DG REGIO. He studied economics and informatics at the Vienna University and holds a PhD in economics. He has worked in economic research and at the OECD. In 1997 he joined the European Commission where he served in several functions, i.p.as Director for Policy Coordination, Director for Policy Development and Director for the Competence Centre for Smart and Sustainable Growth. Since 2019, Rudolf is in charge of international relations at DG REGIO.

Nelson Jorge is Team Leader at the Partnership Instrument of the European Union's Foreign Policy Instruments (FPI). He looks after global projects in environment, climate, energy and international urban development.

Dominique, Li is the managing director of Guangzhou Global Star Investment Ltd. Global Star is wholly owned by Guangzhou Development District (GDD) Government. It formerly served as a window for GDD in Hong Kong, specialized in dealing with international projects and overseas resources. It is also the specific undertaker of China-EU regional cooperation in GDD and could provide the incubator, capital, talent policy, market and potential customers resources for international innovative enterprises. Dominique has over 19-year working experience in Global Star. He has led and participated in the introduction, negotiation, consulting services and investment for various Fortune 500 corporations.

He is one of the senior bureaucrats from Government of Goa and has hold several important positions since his induction in Goa government. He is an expert in environmental and urban planning, energy transition, renewable energy, impact assessment and risk analysis, information technology for digital twins (GIS and BIM). Now he is working as Project Manager of European Projects on Energy Efficiency for *Risorse per Roma SPA*, the in-house agency of Roma Capitale, and Federesco, Italian National Association of the Energy Service Companies. Patrick has a master's degree in environmental engineering and a PhD in urban planning techniques.
